#### I will wear my new uniform.

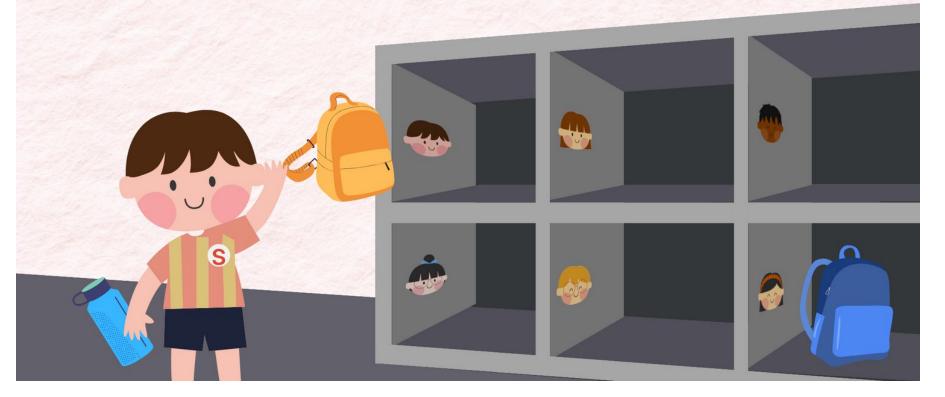


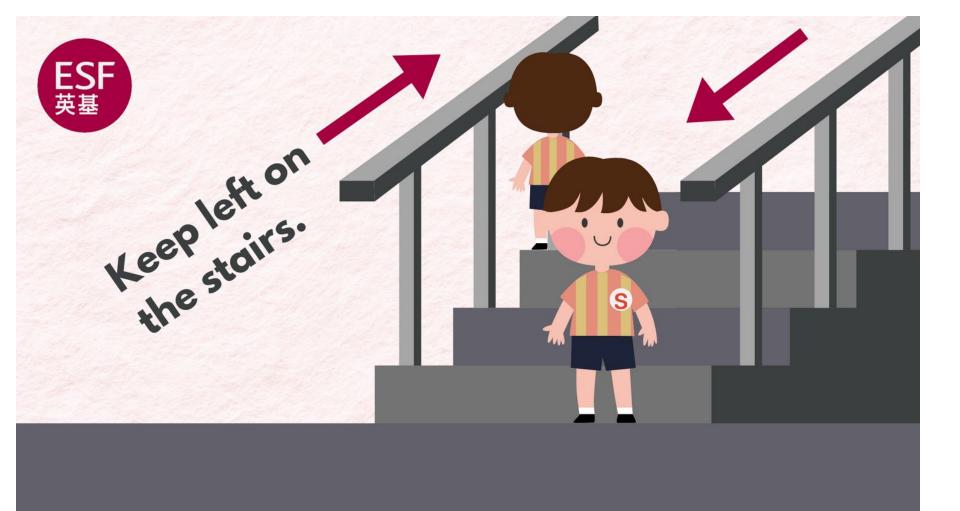




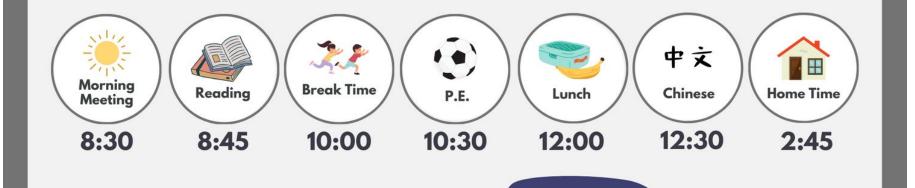
#### Put my things in my cubby hole.

### During break time, I can also draw or read by myself.

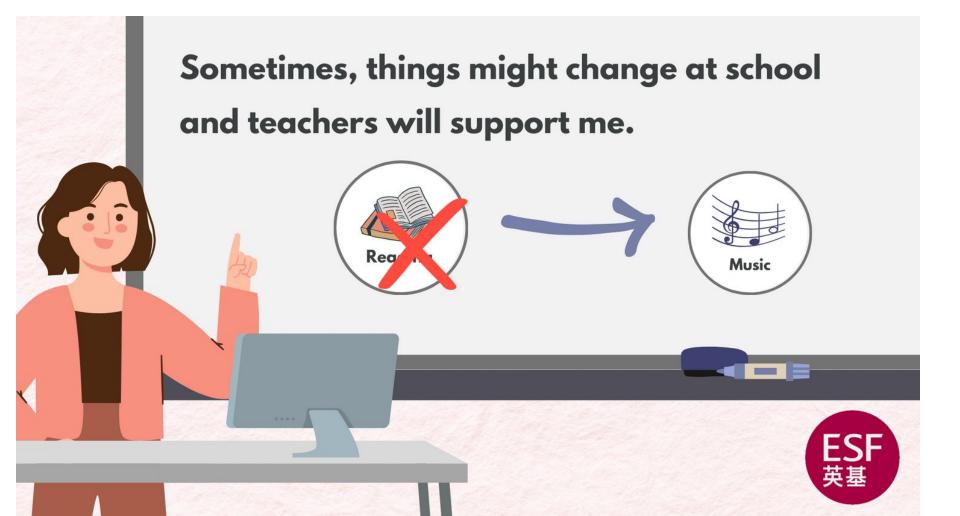






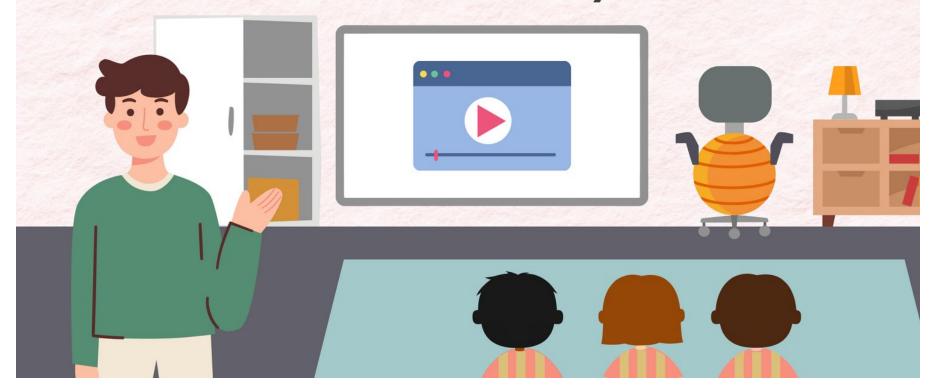
It's break time!

When my teacher is away from school or sick, a different adult will take my class.



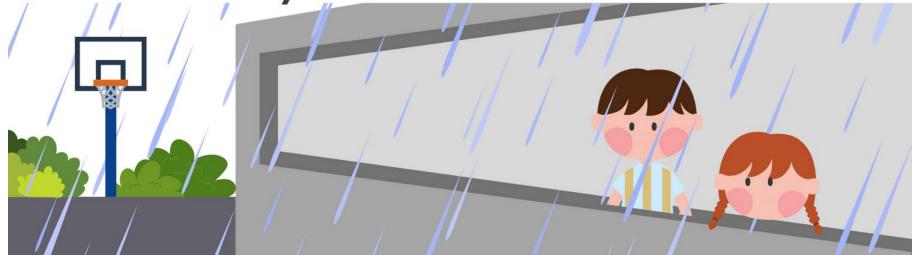




On rainy days, I may stay inside.
